

Date: 29-31 January 2019

1. If you make use of official accommodation in the Vet camp:

- Own towels (bedding is provided)
- The accommodation is mostly twin-bedded rooms.
- Ablution facilities are shared. Kitchen facilities are shared – some fridge/freezer space available; crockery and cutlery and some pots and pans available; small microwave, toaster, kettle in kitchen.
- There is a Lapa/braai area available.
- Own food and drinks
- The code for the sliding gate is 0762
- The camp attendant is Ruth Mkabela (072 278 9692)). She will assist with your accommodation allocation on arrival.
- **Please leave the key in the door when you depart on the last day!!!!**
- **Rooms must be evacuated by 10h00**

2. If you make use of hut in research camp

- Accommodation can be accessed after 14h00
- Own towel
- Bedding provided.
- En suite bathroom & kitchen facilities
- The huts will be open and the keys will be in the door. Please feel free to contact me or Ingrid Kitshoff if there are any problems (082 887 8058) or (078 099 6106).
- **Please leave the key in the door when you depart on the last day!!!!**
- **Rooms must be evacuated by 10h00**

3. There is a 'bring and braai' arranged for the Tuesday evening. We provide pap, sheba & salad but you need to bring own meat and drinks. Own cutlery and crockery etc (i.e. picnic basket for 'bring and braai'.

4. The lectures will be at the Game Capture Auditorium which is situated in the Veterinary Wildlife Services Building.

5. Course registration will be between 11h00 and 12h00 on Tuesday morning (29 January 2019).

6. Payment due and accommodation allocation will be done during registration.

7. If payment has been made via electronic transfer (EFT), please ensure that you have a copy of the proof of payment with you.

8. Manuals & Power point presentations will be handed out, but attendees are responsible for their own stationary.
9. A late pass will be available at the Skukuza main gate (with security guard) to allow you to go to the restaurant in the evening if you need to do so, or to travel from main camp to the 'bring & braai' on the Thursday evening.
10. Coffee, tea & sandwiches are provided during the morning breaks, but the rest of the meals are own account.
